

Shared Agenda for Trade and Development Policy

1) Elevate Global Development as a Core Objective of U.S. Trade Policy

- Expand and improve trade preference programs, including duty-free, quota-free access for the poorest countries.
- Take into account disparities in development and poverty levels with our trading partners.
- Integrate and coordinate trade policy and foreign assistance to enhance the development impacts of both.

2) Promote Open Trade to Stimulate Economic Development and Growth

- Support the G-20 and APEC stand-still declarations committing to forego trade and investment restrictions.
- Bring the Doha Round of WTO negotiations to a successful conclusion in accordance with the original Doha Development Agenda.

3) Expand and Enhance Capacity Building Programs

- Expand programs that give developing countries the tools to pursue economic development.
- Expand public-private partnerships through the USAID Global Development Alliance and other programs.
- Provide greater resources and technical assistance to developing countries for improved labor standards, environmental sustainability and public health.
- Incorporate a more integrated approach to gender analysis and the inclusion of women in capacity building.
